Viura (80%) blended with other varieties, Gran Cerdo, Spain More details: Rioja, 2016,13%, no oak

Fresh, fruity, medium-bodied, and easy-going, this is unusually good value for a small production, naturally-made wine.

Semillon/Sauvignon blend, Chateau Martet, France More details: AOC Sainte-Foy-Bordeaux, 2015, 13%, no oak 26

Fresh, clean, and gently fruity, with a little body from some short ageing on the lees, it makes for a good all-rounder.

Chardonnay "Classic", Jean-Paul Brun, France More details: AOC Beaujolais Blanc, 2015, 12%, no oak 28

If you've never tried white Beaujolais before, you'll be far from alone. This is similar to Macon-style chardonnay from Burgundy. Less acidic than some other grape varieties, especially sauvignon blanc, it has a classic buttery feel to it, and ends with a gently mineral finish.

Chenin Blanc 'Renaissance', Radford Dale, South Africa 30 More details: Stellenbosch, 2011, 13%, barrel-fermented and matured 11 months

FEWER THAN 6 BOTTLES IN STOCK

This is a serious wine that delivers complexity, minerality and elegance, and is priced to be very good value. The oak flavours (mainly from used barrels) are pronounced but not overpowering.

Kerner, Cantina Toblino, Italy More details: DOC Trentino, 2016, 12%, aged in stainless steel tanks

Not the best known of grape varieties, but don't let that put you off. This is a clean, elegant, easy-going high altitude white.

Riesling '1000 Eimerberg', Franz Josef Gritsch, Austria 31 More details: Wachau, 2013, 12%, aged in large old oak vats, but there is not much impact from the oak on the taste of the wine

Lively, dry, complex, Riesling from a very good vintage.

Pinot Noir, Casa Azul, Chile More details: Casablanca valley, 2016, 13%, no oak	0
Fresh strawberry and raspberry fruit, quite delicate, and great value.	
Primitivo, Fatalone, Italy More details: DOC Gioia del Colle, Puglia, 2014, 15%, organic grapes, natural yeasts, minimal sulphur, 6 months in stainless steel and 6 months in oak.	4
This is rustic, rich and warming. It is certainly not what you might call an elegant wine, bit if you like this kind of thing it can be very satisfying, particularly on cold winter nights.	
Cannonau 'Sartiu', Giuseppe Sedilesu, Italy More details: DOCG Cannonau di Sardegna, 2015, 14.5%, aged in cement vats	7
Ripe, big-flavoured, powerful yet fresh.	
Monastrell 'Serie Wild', Pedro Olivares, Spain More details: Murcia, 2015, 14%, organic, high-altitude, old barrels & concrete tank	-
Fruity, powerful and full-bodied, with a good bit of texture to it.	
Merlot/Cabernet Sauvignon/Malbec, Chateau La Claymore, France More details: AOC Lussac St Emilion, 2011, 14%, 18 months in old and new barrels	
A rich and approachable style of Bordeaux. The oak does not dominate and the frui is generous.	t
Grenache, Domaine Raspail-Ay, France More details: AOC Gigondas, 2014 14.5%, aged in large oak 'foudres'	В
